Older Adult 65+ Households 2010 Census

- 64,637 owner-occupied units in Marin
 ▶ 21,816 homes (34%) has a householder age 65+
 - ➢ Of the 42,192 older adults age 65+, 52% live in owner-occupied homes
 - > 8,007 homeowners age 65+ (19% of 65+ pop) live alone
- 15.3% of 65+ pop (6,437 people) renters
 ▶ 73% of renters age 65+ live alone

Older Adults 65+ Living Alone

- 30.1% of Marin's 65+ population live alone
- Communities where 1:3 people age 65+ live alone




Poverty in Marin Older Adults 2008-2010

 Approximately 1,500 Marin residents aged 60+ were under the federal poverty level in 2000 compared to ~ 2,000 during 2008-2010

 Over 424 of the 4,126 Marin households that received food stamps in 2008-2010 had at least one person aged 60+ in the household

County Specific Poverty Level – Elder Index for Older Adults in Marin




Elder Index, Renter Living Alone

The Elder Index is a county-specific measure and includes *all* of a senior's basic costs (food, housing, medical care, and transportation).


Small increases in poverty in past decade, Marin County Age 65+


The Eligibility Gap


Renters Living Alone Are the Most Economically Vulnerable


Work Force Participation, Males, 2000 and 2008-2010


Work Force Participation Females 60+

Work Force Participation, Females, 2000 and 2008-2010





History of Medical Conditions in Marin Adults ages 60+

- 6.4% ever diagnosed with diabetes (2009)
- 35.8% diagnosed with high blood pressure (2009)
- 39% ever diagnosed with arthritis (2001)
- 25.1% had high blood cholesterol (2005)
- 17.8% ever diagnosed with heart disease (2009)
- 32.6% ever diagnosed with cancer (2005)
